Holding Tank Ordinance 2017-04

Jim asked if we received any information from the PUC regarding the railroad crossings. We received a letter from the PUC that states an application has been submitted for PennDOT to do this work. Jim asked about posting the speed limit. Mike will do a road test and then will bring his conclusion to the board.

Jim gave an update on the septic, there are 4 or 5 that have not responded. Denise asked for Jim to get the information to her.

New Business – Dennis Brown

Alan Feist said that the Township was in violation due to a right to know request that was returned incomplete and it was not finished in a timely manner. He (Alan) submitted for information on 15 parcels and claims he only received information on 11.

Alan was upset that the continuance was such short notice for their hearing. Denise explained that he was notified as soon as she received word of the continuance.

Alan also had questions on the junkyard permits and the pricing.

Dennis said we will take all his comments into consideration and will get back to him.

Graffus passed out a spreadsheet for the 6 month time period of the original contract to clean it up Feist Property and it is 70% complete. Graffus told Alan Feist that they did not meet the criteria that was in the contract.

Graffus served a property on Lorson Drive last month and since, the property owner cleaned up most of the tree. There is a stump left.

Fire Company Report – Mike read the report for 2 months. There were no comments.

Public Input

A resident asked about a tree on a line on Valley Road. Mike explained it has been on the line for a couple months, it is a Verizon line and they have been notified.
